Evaluation Methods Used:

Every attempt has been made to ensure that this application is accessible to as many people as possible and supports any combination of all major browser, operating system, and assistive technologies.

Internal testing is completed annually using our default template with generic content. In addition, new elements are developed with accessibility in mind and are tested (internally and by clients) before being added to our core software. Finally, any feedback from our clients regarding accessibility is evaluated and added to our cores software so it can benefit the entire higher education community.

We are also extremely lucky to have a very active accessibility community with our clients and take every opportunity to integrate any suggestions into our core software to benefit the entire community.

Where exceptions exist, impact severity and remediation timelines are provided. CourseLeaf uses the following Impact Severity Scale adapted from NYU's Digital Accessibility Office:

Impact Severity	Predicted Impact on Task Completion
None	Not likely to be noticed by user or affect task completion.
